

To hear the stories of fathers, trained through the Dare Facilitator program; courageously speaking to their sons about manhood and purpose for the very first time, was nothing short of amazing. What began in Cape Town is now taking root in other nations, and the ripple effect is only just beginning.

We've refreshed our training materials, renamed our girls' program to "The Dream Program", and built new partnerships both locally and internationally. With each change, we've remained anchored in our mission: to see teens walk confidently in dignity and truth. To our incredible team, partners, volunteers, and every person who has prayed, supported, and believed in this vision, thank you. Your love and commitment are the reason these stories of transformation are possible.

As we step forward, we do so with courage and hope, daring to believe that a generation is rising, restored, equipped, and walking boldly in purpose.




Our first Dare facilitator training in Gqeberha took place in 2023, and it's been truly inspiring to witness the team at Cornerstone not only embrace the program, but also grow into facilitators and trainers. Using the Dare program as a tool for evangelism, the church has welcomed young boys into its youth ministry, creating a positive ripple effect that extends into families and the broader community.

One particularly impactful example is their mentorship journey with 13 young men from a local soccer club, through which they've built meaningful relationships and planted seeds of hope and transformation. We believe this is just the beginning of what God will do through this partnership—and we're expectant for even greater things to come.

We are thrilled to announce this partnership, birthed through a powerful and historic Dare Facilitator Training mission—the very first of its kind in Benin.

Our Dare team traveled to Parakou, Benin, where we spent five days equipping local pastors and leaders to mentor boys on essential issues such as identity, manhood, and the impact of pornography.







The training was rigorous—both physically due to the climate and emotionally as participants engaged with deep-rooted cultural beliefs around fatherhood and masculinity. The training culminated in a moving Dare Day, where newly trained facilitators—including fathers—led open and courageous conversations with boys, many of whom were their own sons.

Following the success of the mission, and after several meaningful conversations, we are honored to now welcome the UEEB as an official partner of the Dignity Campaign.

This new partnership represents a significant step forward in our shared vision: to see boys and men transformed and empowered to live with dignity, purpose, and integrity

Global Impact

The Netherlands





In October 2024, our Director, Crystal, had the honor of attending the Arise and Shine International Women's Conference in the Netherlands, hosted by Verre Naasten and Lume. Themed "Rise and Shine! Let the light of God's grace shine through you on the place He has put you," the conference brought together women from around the world, all united by their passion for ministry and calling to shine God's light in their communities.

As part of her visit, Crystal was invited to present talks at two local churches—NGK Grijpskerk and NGK Centrumkerk in Leek. On Sunday, she spoke powerfully on identity, purpose, and belonging. She also led a session with a group of women, highlighting the realities of period poverty in South Africa and the challenges girls face. A highlight was connecting with women in ministry from around the world, all passionate about serving others despite challenges.

Through the training, Thokozile was equipped not only to teach but to live out her faith and identity, modeling it to the young girls she mentors. She has learned to love them unconditionally, offering them the same grace and care she receives from God.

She has run the Dream Programs in 3 primary and 3 high schools.

What Thokozile loves most about being a facilitator is building trusting relationships and creating safe spaces where girls feel truly valued and loved—no matter their circumstances.

growth.

Working with young boys has taught Angelo the importance of patience, adaptability, and active listening—skills he now uses both in ministry and daily life.

For Angelo, being a Dare Facilitator is deeply rewarding. He finds great purpose in helping young boys build critical life skills and witnessing their growth and transformation. At the same time, he recognizes how this journey is also transforming him. As he puts it, "While God is allowing me to be a blessing to others, He is also blessing me in the process."


Dream Mentor

The facilitator training played a significant role in shaping her journey. It helped her grow personally and clarified her passion for investing in the next generation. The training provided her with practical tools and insight, enabling her to be more intentional and effective in her approach.

One of the most rewarding parts of Kam's role is witnessing the transformation in the girls over time. She enjoys seeing them grow from shy and reserved participants into confident and engaged young individuals. By the time they attend camp, there is a noticeable shift in their energy and presence.



Life Skills Program

The Dream and Dare programmes work together to address gender-based violence and promote healthy identity, purpose, and relationships among young people. Recognising that lasting change requires the involvement of both girls and boys, these initiatives empower youth through gender-specific workshops and follow-up programmes.

Dream equips girls facing challenges like genderbased violence, menstrual barriers, and low selfworth. In a Dream Day, girls explore identity, purpose, and menstrual health, and receive a sustainable menstrual product. They can then join Dream Discipleship, a weekly group offering life skills and biblical guidance in a safe, supportive space.

TOPICS COVERED IN DARE DISCIPLESHIP **PROGRAMME**

- Belonging

- Pornography

Dare challenges boys to explore identity, manhood, and relationships, addressing issues like pornography and harmful attitudes. In Dare Days, they're invited to "Dare to be Different" with a public pledge and wristband, and can join weekly Dare Discipleship groups for deeper discussions.

Zinzi*

Zinzi*, a 22-year-old young women took part in the Dream Day program in 2016. The day was facilitated by Aunty Lindiwe* and was introduced to her through her church. Her most memorable takeaway was learning the importance of self-care, making wise life choices, and involving God in every step.

The program had a significant impact on her understanding of self-respect as a woman and deepened her relationship with God. It helped shape her identity and purpose, guiding her in making better life decisions—such as choosing her friends wisely and striving academically.

Now, a professional dancer, model, and entrepreneur, she credits the program for helping her stay grounded in her faith and focused on a better future. She strongly recommends the Dignity Campaign to other young women, believing it provides the encouragement and tools needed to grow and thrive.

Mentorship Program

Our mentorship program is designed so that teens have a 1-on-1 mentor that will be with them over a period of 12 months. It creates safe spaces for teens to ask questions, allowing them to have a positive role model pouring into their lives and walking with them.

Impact Story

From Self-Doubt to Self-Belief

Imanathi's Journey

Imanathi Sinama is 15 and joined our One-Year Mentorship Program, guided by her mentor, Ms. Vuyiswa Hermans.

Before the program, Imanathi struggled with low self-esteem and lacked a sense of purpose. "I didn't know who I was," she shared. "I believed the negative things people said about me." Through her mentor's guidance and the support of the program, Imanathi began to rewrite her internal narrative—grounding her identity not in others' opinions but in her faith and self-worth. "I learned that I am who my Father in heaven says I am. God is my helper in both good and bad times."

One of the turning points for her was creating a vision board. It helped her imagine a future full of hope and purpose. "I saw myself somewhere else—far from where I am now. I learned that having a vision is a good thing." Topics like decision-making and the consequences of our choices made her reflect deeply and grow in emotional intelligence.





The program changed my life for the better, now I believe in myself. I know more about God. I even encourage other girls now, because I've discovered who I am."

Today, she envisions herself as a motivational speaker, sharing her story and uplifting others. Her journey is a testament to the power of mentorship, faith, and self-discovery—and a shining example of what's possible when young people are given the support and space to grow.

From Uncertainty to Confidence


Tyriq's Journey

Tyriq Wilson is 15 and joined our One-Year Mentorship Program, guided by his mentor, Angelo.

During his time in the program, Tyriq learned valuable lessons about leadership styles and effective communication. These new skills enhanced his ability to collaborate with others and take initiative in leading school projects more efficiently.

The experience was life-changing for Tyriq. It helped him build confidence and embrace new opportunities. He shared that before the program, he saw himself as just a regular person—but now, he recognizes his uniqueness and views himself as created in the image of God, a temple of God.






The program helped me develop new skills and boosted my confidence. This made me open myself up to new opportunities.


