

She wants to be a nurse. She has always had a desire to help others.

Unfortunately, Thobisa never has had someone to look after her, and if this wasn't hard enough, she also has to look after her three siblings. Her father is an alcoholic and is not contributing towards the care of the family. Thobisa cannot afford menstrual products, which means she misses one week of school every month and may not be able to complete her education. This is not the way to make her dream a reality. One day, an auntie invited her to a Dignity Day for girls, hosted by her church.

At this event, Thobisa heard about how much worth and value she had. She learned that she was made in the image of God and that her life had purpose. They even taught her about the female body, puberty, and the menstrual cycle.

When she was asked if she would like to choose a menstrual cup or washable pads and panties as a gift, she made her choice. She went home that day feeling empowered to continue pursuing her dream.
